CHALLENGE

So Much Space, So Little Time

With over 95 conference rooms of varying ability and capacity, the task of “seamless communication” between RealPage’s 1,500 employees was overwhelming at best. As such, standardization became imperative for optimal performance. It was also crucial to keep the technology as simple as possible to avoid unnecessary frustration before each meeting.

ACTION

Standardization and Automation

The solution was to make each of the 95 meeting rooms fall into 3 easy categories and automatically set themselves to the occupants’ established preferences when they enter. A-styled rooms have a basic phone conference system. B-styled rooms have a phone conference system and a media screen. C-styled rooms include video conferencing capabilities. Each meeting room is also outfitted with occupancy sensors that update Outlook via Crestron control. These allow a user to know if a conference room is occupied and can even cancel a meeting if a scheduled room is unoccupied. Finally, the design included a fully functional video production studio, wayfinding, digital signage and complete control room solution.

RESULT

A Well-Oiled Machine

The end result is an elaborate yet intuitive communication system fit for such a megacomplex that facilitates stress-free collaboration rather than hindering it. Through standardization and automation, employees will always know what to do and what to expect for each room before they even enter. This sets them up for success from the word “Go!”
